What is a Healthy Kids Zone (HKZ)?

A project that brings community members within a $\frac{1}{2}$ mile radius of a school to work together to identify community challenges and health promoting policy solutions to those challenges.

The ½ mile: Health happens where we live, work, and play

Community Engagement

- Promoted project throughout the community in various settings
- Strengthened partnership with schools & other community groups
- Residents trained on conducting assessments, outreach strategies, and sharing their story



Successes

- Engaged with 1773 residents to understand issues from a community perspective
- 63 total youth and adult residents have been trained as HKZ Ambassadors
- Workgroup to includes 16 local community organizations and 7 residents



HKZ Ambassadors



Community Health Councils Anyone who lives, works or cares about improving the health of the community within the HKZ area and commits to outreach, education, and engagement activities with other residents.



Community Assessment

HKZ Ambassadors

- surveyed residents to identify the top community challenges to health & wellbeing
- conducted a Built Environment assessment of assets and deficits in the community
- organized community meetings to help analyze the data and collect input on potential policy solutions to the community-identified issues
 Successes





- Conducted a built environment assessment of 29 of 40 areas of the community
- Engaged with and received input from 66 local business and churches
- Obtained 350 Input cards on the data
- 8 focus group sessions occurred with 150 participants in total

Emerging Issues

- 1) Education on the new cannabis laws
- 2) Improving street infrastructure
- 3) Public Safety
- 4) Affordable Housing





Where do we go from here?

- Engage with Public Agencies that have jurisdiction over and Community Groups that work on the identified issues
- Work with the local Neighborhood Council to identify their role and the resources they need
- Community forums/events in early 2019, where stakeholders will confirm the issues and prioritize strategies to advance
- HKZ Ambassadors and workgroup members will develop a plan to advance strategies
- Create Playbook for replication
