COMING OUT OF COVID WITH BETTER SCHOOLS

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LOST LEARNING DURING TIMES OF CLOSED SCHOOLS

- Significant learning losses from universal closures
- Full extent of harm not yet known
- Disproportionate imacts
- Growing economic costs of remote schooling
