

Street lighting is a fundamental component of public infrastructure, and its functionality is essential for the safety and well-being of our communities. Working streetlights allow families to walk home safely, provide safe routes for local running clubs, and support vibrant, active neighborhoods after dark.


Yet many areas across the City continue to face streetlight outages due to aging infrastructure, copper wire theft, and delayed repairs. Streetlight outages have more than doubled Citywide since 2021, with approximately 1,900 reports in Boyle Heights last year alone. Neighborhoods most impacted by copper wire theft – including Boyle Heights, El Sereno, and Lincoln Heights – experience prolonged periods without functioning lights. These setbacks not only compromise public safety but also exacerbate inequities in communities that have historically been under-resourced.

Establishing a dedicated street lighting crew for Council District 14 is a necessary and proactive measure that strengthens public safety, reinforces the delivery of essential services, and ensures that all residents feel safe, connected, and supported in their neighborhoods.

I THEREFORE MOVE that \$1,070,000 from the AB1290 Fund No. 53P, Account No. 281214 (CD 14 Redevelopment Projects - Services) be transferred / appropriated to the below listed Accounts and in the amounts specified in the Department of Public Works, Bureau of Street Lighting Fund 100-84 for a Council District 14-dedicated streetlight repair crew:

The General City Purposes (GCP) Fund of the 2025-26 Adopted Budget includes funding for Heritage Month Celebrations and Special Events. Latino Heritage Month is an annual event which should receive a portion of this funding, and has received funding in the past.

This effort is of special benefit to the residents of the City and deserves financial assistance from the City. Sufficient funds are available in the Council's portion of the Heritage Month Celebrations and Special Events line item.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Council:

1. Allocate and Authorize \$16,000 of the Council's portion of the Heritage Month Celebration & Special Events line item in the General City Purposes Fund No. 100-56 to fund any aspect of the Latino Heritage Month event.
2. On June 8, 2025 City Council approved a report and instruction to the General Services Department to authorize the development and operation of a visitor information center and public restroom at 1627 Vine Street, a City-owned property (Council File Number 18-0534-S1). The report inadvertently omitted the following language documenting the approval of an exemption from competitive bids:

"In accordance with Los Angeles City Charter Section 371(e)(10) and Administrative Code Section 10.15(a)(10), the City Council finds that the use of a competitive bidding process for this contract is impractical and not in the City's best interest, and therefore grants an exemption.

Hollywood Partnership Ventures dba Hollywood Partnership Community Trust is uniquely positioned to implement the proposed project involving the development and operation of a Visitor Information Center and public restrooms at 1627 Vine Street, a City-owned property in the heart of the Hollywood Entertainment District. As the nonprofit affiliate of The Hollywood Partnership—administrator of the Hollywood Entertainment District Property-Based Business Improvement District (PBID) - the organization possesses specialized local knowledge, operational capacity, and established relationships with community stakeholders.

The Hollywood Partnership Community Trust is already engaged in managing public spaces and providing visitor support services in the area, making them particularly qualified to deliver a project that requires both physical infrastructure oversight and community-oriented programming. Their proven ability to operate in the Hollywood core ensures immediate mobilization, continuity of service, and alignment with local economic and tourism goals.

Given the highly specific geographic and operational requirements of the project, issuing a competitive solicitation would not yield a more qualified or appropriately situated provider. Therefore, the exemption from competitive bidding is justified under Charter Section 371(e)(10) and Administrative Code Section 10.15(a)(10), which allow such exceptions when use of the competitive process would be impractical or contrary to the City's interests. The City Council finds that, under Los Angeles City Charter Section 371(e)(10) and Administrative Code Section 10.15(a)(10), a competitive bidding process is impractical and therefore exempt for this contract."
