CITY CLERK CERTIFIES SUFFICIENCY OF SIGNATURES ON INITIATIVE ORDINANCE PETITION

AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND LABOR STANDARDS FOR GENERAL PLAN AMENDMENTS AND ZONING CHANGES

LOS ANGELES (June 8, 2016) — Los Angeles City Clerk Holly L. Wolcott announced today that the number of verified signatures filed by proponents relative to *Affordable Housing and Labor Standards for General Plan Amendments and Zoning Changes,* has achieved sufficiency.

The petition contained 94,238 signatures. In order for the petition to be deemed sufficient, 61,487* valid signatures were required. As provided by the City's Election Code, the City Clerk utilized a random sampling procedure which included the examination of at least 5% of the signatures. The statistical sampling showed that the number of valid signatures was 110% or more of the number needed to declare the petition sufficient, which satisfied the minimum threshold. The City Clerk certified the results on June 7, 2016 and will now prepare and present a Certification of Sufficiency report to the City Council.

Charter Section 452 provides that the Council must take one of the following three actions within 20 days of the Clerk's transmittal of the Certificate of Sufficiency to the City Council:

- 1. Adopt the proposed ordinance without alteration;
- 2. Call a special election to be held not earlier than 110 days or later than 140 days after Council action on the petition; or
- 3. Determine to place the ordinance on the ballot at either the next regular City election or the next County election to be held more than 110 days from the date of Council action on the petition.

The Office of the City Clerk administers elections for the City of Los Angeles, the Los Angeles Unified School District, and the Los Angeles Community College District.
