ELECTION REMINDER

ALL VOTE CENTERS OPEN MARCH 2, 2024

2024 PRIMARY NOMINATING ELECTION

LOS ANGELES (**March 1, 2024**) — Los Angeles City Clerk Holly L. Wolcott reminds Los Angeles County registered voters that **all** Vote Centers will now be open Saturday, March 2, 2024, through Election Day, March 5, 2024. Candidates for Los Angeles City Council Districts 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, and 14, Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) Board of Education Offices 1, 3, 5, and 7, and the City ballot measure - Initiative Ordinance HLA, will be included on the City of Los Angeles ballot.

All voters can cast their ballots at any Vote Center in the County of Los Angeles, mail in their ballot by Election Day (if postmarked by Election Day and received within seven days), or securely drop off their voted Vote-By-Mail ballot at any Official Drop-Box or Vote Center throughout the County.

CONDITIONAL VOTER REGISTRATION:

Eligible Los Angeles County residents who missed the February 20, 2024, registration deadline can still vote at any Vote Center in LA County. Under California Election Law, Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) allows a prospective voter to conditionally register and cast a ballot. For more information please visit:
