MAY 15, 2007 GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION – 7 DAYS TO GO!

Los Angeles City Clerk Frank T. Martinez announced today that the **May 15, 2007 General Municipal Election is 7 days away**. All registered voters are encouraged to review their Official Sample Ballot before going to vote on Tuesday, May 15, 2007. Holding an election takes the cooperation and support of hundreds of volunteers from the community to ensure that all voters have the opportunity to vote. For this election, the City of Los Angeles has established 2,258 at-polls precincts staffed by over 9,032 Precinct Board Members. Additionally, an estimated 1,000 workers are used election night to staff ballot collection depots, drive trucks and sedans, and tabulate the results of your voting. The City Clerk and many community volunteer workers are ready to aid you in casting your ballot on Election Day.

Remember to mark your Official Sample Ballot with your choices and take it with you to the polls. **Also, the location of your polling place is shown on the back cover of your Official Sample Ballot.** Please make note of it. The polls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.
