RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on August 19, 2023, the Mayor declared a state of local emergency relating to Tropical Storm Hilary; and

WHEREAS, the Governor on August 19, 2023, issued a proclamation declaring an emergency for much of Southern California, including Los Angeles County, to support response and recovery efforts in response to Tropical Storm Hilary; and

WHEREAS, on Sunday August 20, 2023, Tropical Storm Hilary became the first tropical storm to hit Southern California in 84 years; and

WHEREAS, Tropical Storm Hilary brought record-breaking rainfall to Southern California which the National Weather Service's Los Angeles office said broke "virtually all rainfall daily records" for the region in August; and

WHEREAS, Tropical Storm Hilary caused extreme conditions such as power outages, damage to power poles, fallen trees, and damaging floodwaters, including in a commercial stretch of Melrose Avenue in Los Angeles; and

WHEREAS, the City is still responding to the effects of Tropical Storm Hilary;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Los Angeles RESOLVES that:

- 1. A local emergency regarding impacts from Tropical Storm Hilary existed in the City of Los Angeles (City) within the meaning of Los Angeles Administrative Code Section 8.21, *et seq.*, at the time of the Mayor's August 19, 2023, Declaration of Local Emergency, which the City Council hereby ratifies; and
- 2. Because the local emergency continues to exist, there is a need to continue the declared state of local emergency, which the City Council hereby ratifies; and
- 3. In accordance with Los Angeles Administrative Code section 8.21 *et seq.*, all appropriate City departments, agencies, and personnel are instructed and requested to continue to perform all duties and responsibilities to represent the City in this matter to prevent and abate the emergency and receive, process, and coordinate all inquiries and requirements necessary to obtain whatever State and Federal assistance that may become available to the City and/or to the citizens of the City who may be affected by the emergency; and
- 4. The General Manager of the Emergency Management Department is hereby instructed, as appropriate, to advise the Mayor and City Council on the need to extend the state of local emergency; and
- 5. The City Clerk is hereby instructed, unless and until Council directs otherwise or discontinues the state of emergency, to timely agendize this matter so that Council may consider whether to continue the state of emergency; and
- 6. The City Clerk is hereby instructed to forward copies of this Resolution to the Governor of the State of California, the Director of the Office of Emergency Services of the State of California, the Los Angeles County Office of Emergency Management, and the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors.
