- h. Recommending measures to ensure that such a program would not have a disproportionate impact on certain Council Districts or underserved communities, and mitigate any unintended consequences.
- i. Conducting an analysis of cost estimates for the proposed program.
- j. Identifying potential revenue sources to fund the proposed services to address existing public health challenges and support Recreational Vehicle residents in transitioning to permanent housing.

On August 8, 2024, the Board of Harbor Commissioners took action to approve the defeasance of a number of bonds. The Board authorized the cash defeasance of approximately \$103 million of outstanding bond debt issued in 2015 and 2016. Cash defeasance would allow the Harbor Department to repay its bond debt early, yielding approximately \$35.5 million in interest savings over 15 years. Separately, the Harbor Department is also in the process of refunding approximately \$265 million in bonds that were originally issued in 2014 (CF: 24-0893). The Harbor Department is legally required to initiate the defeasance 15 days prior to pricing new bonds associated with the refunding transaction.

Immediate action is necessary to waive review of the approval of the cash defeasance of 2015 Series A, 2016 Series B, and 2016 Series C Refunding Revenue Bonds, in order to avoid delays to possible future actions due to legal considerations.

The Rory M. Shaw Wetlands Park Project (Park Project) is located in the community of Sun Valley in the City of Los Angeles, that was committed to the region over 20 years ago, and is a keystone project in the Sun Valley Watershed Management Plan, which the City of Los Angeles, Los Angeles County, and the Sun Valley Watershed Stakeholders Group have partnered to develop into a multi-benefit open space and environmental habitat. The project entails converting a landfill to a wetlands park facility to provide enhanced water quality, flood protection, groundwater recharge, habitat creation and recreational use.

The Park Project’s objectives are two-fold; 1) Mitigate local flood risk and reduce stormwater pollution, while increasing water conservation, recreational opportunities, and wildlife habitat; and, 2) Develop a multi-benefit park on the site of an inert debris landfill. Per the city’s actions in 2021 via CF 21-0833, once completed, the park will be turned over by the County to the City of Los Angeles for ownership, operations, and maintenance.

The complexity of the Park Project has proven challenging - in addition to being a multi-jurisdiction effort, the site’s final specs, grading plans, and environmental analysis continues to be adjusted based on current conditions. Also, the inflationary impacts on the construction industry has impacted fiscal and budgetary estimates and staff are continually readjusting the scope to fit realistic expectations and all regulatory permitting requirements. To date, the construction cost has significantly increased and is now estimated to be over \$200 million. This increase has created a growing gap in project funds to move the Rory Shaw Wetlands Park Project forward into construction.

On April 9, 2024, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors passed a motion, instructing and authorizing the Director of Public Works and Chief Engineer of the Los Angeles County Flood Control District to address site security and develop a funding plan to complete Rory Shaw through other funding opportunities. In 2021, the City committed \$17,800,000 of Prop O Clean Water Bond Program funds toward the completion of the Park Project including property acquisition, design, and construction.

The City of Los Angeles, via the Bureau of Engineering (BOE) and Bureau of Sanitation (LASAN), is contributing Proposition O funding to the project and developing a master cooperating agreement for the transfer of ownership, operations, and maintenance of the Park Project (CF 21-0833). The BOE, Rec and Parks and LASAN should provide the City Council with a status update on their roles in the project, related street and sidewalk improvements for Tujunga, Strathern, and Fair streets, the latest on the City’s portion of the Park Project budget and potential shortfalls, and address the onsite security and safety challenges for this long delayed construction project.

**I THEREFORE MOVE** that the BOE, Rec and Parks, and LASAN, with assistance from the City Administrative Officer and the Chief Legislative Analyst, report in 60 days, on the status of the project cooperating agreement and related street and sidewalk projects, clarify the previous agreement to transfer the park from the County to the City upon completion, and verify the City’s financial and administrative contributions to the Rory Shaw Wetlands Park Project to date.

**I FURTHER MOVE** that the report includes a comprehensive list of additional supplemental funding opportunities available to the City and County to close the funding gaps and to fully complete the project.

CIVIL RIGHTS, EQUITY, AGING & DISABILITY

MOTION

In 2021, the Council approved a Participatory Budgeting pilot, the Los Angeles Reforms for Equity and Public Acknowledgement of Institutional Racism (L.A. REPAIR) program (C.F. 21-1187), spearheaded by the Civil + Human Rights and Equity Department (CHRED). This program is aimed to empower residents to have direct influence over approximately \$8.5 million allocated to nine historically disadvantaged and underinvested neighborhoods, categorized as REPAIR Zones. To date, all REPAIR Zones have held elections and residents voted for their preferred projects for their community. CHRED is working with the subcontractors to finish implementation and conduct a final evaluation on program goals.

Every community determines the best use of their REPAIR Zone's public dollars, as long as the idea is legal and would benefit the community it's intended to serve. According to the Grant Guidelines, the programming and services of the project must prioritize and serve the REPAIR Zone constituents. An alternate location for the project outside, but adjacent, of the REPAIR Zone can be considered so long as it can accommodate the community expectations to provide services to the constituents of the REPAIR Zone.

This exception is concerning for REPAIR Zones, especially those that are made up of three large neighborhoods. Challenges like having no means of transportation to access REPAIR Zone services and simply not being aware of the project's location and rollout can lead to the unintentional exclusion of REPAIR Zone members, some of whom may have actively voted for the project.

Despite Grant Guidelines permitting REPAIR Zone projects to be conducted outside of the zone, the Civil + Human Rights and Equity Department must adopt an internal policy to refrain from allowing projects to be implemented outside of their respective REPAIR Zones.


**I THEREFORE MOVE** that the City Council instruct the Civil + Human Rights and Equity Department to amend the Los Angeles Reforms for Equity and Public Acknowledgement of Institutional Racism Participatory Budgeting Grant Guidelines for Proposers to require that future programs and/or projects emanate from within the boundaries of each respective REPAIR Zone.



In October 2011, Assembly Bill 678 was enacted to add Section 14105.94 to the Welfare and Institutions Code, enabling public agencies to receive supplemental Medi-Cal reimbursement for Ground Emergency Medical Transportation (GEMT) services. The supplemental reimbursements for the GEMT program funding was provided by the Federal Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).

The State Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) with the approval of CMS developed Cost Report Forms for cost submission by the participating agencies. A reconciliation process was included in the program wherein the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) audited the submitted cost reports of participating agencies.

During fiscal year 2022, DHCS conducted audits of LAFD's GEMT cost reports covering the fiscal years 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022. In the fall of 2023, DHCS notified LAFD that the City received an overpayment of \$570 for FY 2019-20 and \$21,711 for FY 2020-21 for a total overpayment of \$22,281.

DHCS transmitted to the City a demand to remit the overpayment of \$22,281. Given that the City received, GEMT revenues of approximately \$33.8M in FY 2022-23 and \$2.6M in FY 2023-24, and DHCS continues to be a partner in the current evolution of the GEMT program (Assembly Bill 1705), it would be prudent to authorize remittance of \$22,281 by the LAFD to DHCS.

I THEREFORE MOVE that City Council authorize the City Controller to issue a \$22,281 refund payment from Fire Department Fund No. 100/38, Revenue Source No. 4451 (Emergency Ambulance Services), to the State Department of Health Care Services (DHCS), upon receipt of invoices and in accordance with the deadline established by DHCS, for the refund of their overpayment of Ground Emergency Medical Transportation program City receipts.




