#### A. PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

- 1. PRESENT and ADOPT the accompanying ORDINANCE relative to amending Section 103.206 of the Los Angeles Municipal Code relative to incorporating an alarm verification policy and provide false alarm service fees and penalties.
- 2. INSTRUCT the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to review these fees, and the costs of providing these services, on an annual basis.
- 3. INSTRUCT the Office of Finance to report back after the first quarter, on the status of the fee collection and processing.
- 4. INSTRUCT the Information Technology Agency (ITA) and LAPD's Technology Division to report back after the first quarter, on the tracking of false alarms.
- 5. INSTRUCT the LAPD, Communications Division, with the assistance of the ITA, to establish incident data entry standards for Alarm Company Operation (ACO) information.

- 6. INSTRUCT the LAPD, Communications Division, with the assistance of the ITA to establish incident data entry standards for the "APT" field.
- 7. INSTRUCT the LAPD, Communications Division, with the assistance of the ITA, to assess the feasibility of compiling an appropriate list of addresses containing multi-unit buildings, and including the addresses in the Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) "Special Locations" database.
- 8. AUTHORIZE the Office of Finance (OOF), in coordination with the Police Commission's Alarm Section, City Administrative Officer (CAO), City Attorney and Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA), to arrange for a Permit Compliance Project as described in the Client Lists and Permit Compliance section of the CLA report dated April 9, 2004, and to report back in 45 days concerning the progress of such action.
- 10. INSTRUCT the CAO, with the assistance of the CLA, to report back in 45 days with a financial analysis that is based on the final recommendations and adoption of the Alarm Ordinance.
- 11. REQUEST the Police Commission to review and modify its current operations and procedures to conform with the Alarm Dispatch Policy and Alarm Ordinance, and to report back in 45 days on the progress of such action.
- 12. INSTRUCT the CLA, City Attorney, and CID to monitor the legality of the City of Oakland Ordinance (making both the alarm company and alarm owners responsible for paying false alarm fees) and DRAFT an education campaign similar to the City of Oakland.
- 13. INSTRUCT the OOF, with the assistance of the CID, to bill elected City officials for false alarm dispositions.
- 14. INSTRUCT the City Attorney and CLA to investigate the possibility of setting standards for, or licensing of, alarm companies.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: The CLA reports that adoption of the Ordinance in its current form, will have a positive impact on the General Fund. However, a financial analysis should be completed after final adoption of the Ordinance. Projected revenue items include the current and future increases in alarm permit applications; elimination of free false alarms; increase in the false alarm fee; application of false alarm penalties; and, increased use of the collection agencies on contract with the City.

Projected revenue items may be offset by proposed expenditures, such as the enhancement of the Emergency Command Control Communications System dispatch and False Alarm System; OOF temporary staffing needs to process the projected increase in permit applications; printing and mailing costs; and, technology adjustments to provide for on-line permitting and payment processing. In addition, the Dispatch Policy provides that after two false alarms in a rolling year, police response is based on the availability of an officer (if no verification is provided), which may create an overall decrease in the number of false alarm citations issued.

The ITA reports that modifications to the False Alarms System will not impact the General Fund as the work will be done by existing support staff. The cost to implement false alarm tracking in the new Printrak CAD is approximately \$145,000. The initial cost to implement online alarm permit registration and payment is \$12,901.

#### B. EDUCATION AND NEIGHBORHOODS COMMITTEE REPORT

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

- 1. CONCUR in the recommendations of the Public Safety Committee in its report dated July 21, 2004.
- 2. INSTRUCT the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA), Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) and Office of Finance (OOF) to meet with industry experts and report to the Education and Neighborhoods (EN) Committee with a detailed report of the outreach efforts to be implemented for instructions and information on the new ordinance and false alarm penalties.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: The CLA reports that it is expected that the draft alarm ordinance, in its current form, will have a positive impact on the General Fund. However, a financial analysis should be completed after the final adoption of the ordinance. The projected revenue items include the current and future increases in alarm permit applications; elimination of free false alarms; increase in the false alarm fee; application of false alarm penalties, and increased use of the collection agencies which are on contract with the City.

#### C. BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT
