- 20. Actions Contained in this Report to Achieve Greater Compliance with the Recently Adopted Financial Policies, recognizing that the Policy Statement had not yet been approved when the Proposed Budget was developed:
 - a. Reserve Fund: Increase the Mayor's Proposed Reserve Fund of 2.88% (\$113.218M) to 3.35% (\$131.467M) (i.e., an increase of \$18.249M). This amount is more than the 2004-05 Adopted Budget Level of 3.07% (\$120.5M). This action is consistent with discussions during the adoption of the Financial Policies to incrementally increase the Reserve Fund to 5% of General Fund revenues.

- b. 1% of Budget for Capital and Infrastructure Projects: The Proposed Budget is about \$8,700,000 shy of the \$39,000,000 Capital and Infrastructure Policy amount. This amount would be reduced by \$1,400,000, to \$7,300,000, if the proposed addition for the 50/50 Sidewalk Repair Program is approved. It may be further reduced if additional Reserve Funds in excess of the Adopted Budget amount are identified at year-end closing. Further, the City Administrative Officer and the Chief Legislative Analyst are instructed to report back with recommendations for a process by which capital projects will be recommended for funding.
- c. Cost Recovery: The CAO and CLA have already been instructed to report back on cost recovery for all fees for special services under CF 04-1822. Cost recovery is an important element to ensure continuation and potential expansion of City programs and services, including public safety, infrastructure, and public services. During the Committee's budget deliberations, there was much attention focused on the solid waste collection and disposal program. The CLA advised that while he supports cost recovery, there needs to be an implementation process because of ongoing and unresolved policy issues. In the interim, this Committee recommends that the Council take the following actions:
 - RECOGNIZE that the City subsidizes the cost of the solid waste and disposal program by approximately \$209,000,000 per year (or about \$27/month/single family residence);
 - ii) ADOPT an ordinance which permits the City to recover costs associated with the refuse collection and disposal program;
 - iii) INSTRUCT the CAO, CLA, and the Bureau of Sanitation to report back with *what a full cost recovery schedule for solid waste collection and disposal costs over a phase-in period of 5 or 10 years *would be; and
 - iv) INSTRUCT the Bureau of Sanitation to report back to the Environmental Quality and Waste Management Committee with a plan to educate Neighborhood Councils on the solid waste collection and disposal fees and to conduct the appropriate outreach and notification to Neighborhood Councils prior to the implementation of such *any fee increases. *(Greuel - LaBonge)
