PRESENTATION OF REPORT BY THE BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE relative to the Mayor's Proposed 2006-07 Budget for the City of Los Angeles, related Motions and Resolutions.

Community Impact Statement: On April 20, 2006 the Historic Highland Park Neighborhood Council (HHPNC) voted to adamantly and vigorously oppose the Mayor's proposed trash collection hike of 100% (from \$11 to \$22), especially after an 83% hike in two stages last year (first from \$6 per month to \$10 and then to \$11). This is not a proper way to tax and to raise funding for police, and in fact is far and away more than is needed to put 1,000 new police on the streets. It is an attempt to get completely discretionary funds for the City. LAPD can't even fill its current training slots at the academy and increased funding is not going to improve that situation. The past property tax increase proposal to increase police also failed.

Community Impact Statement: The Greater Griffith Park Neighborhood Council supports the development and implementation of a Park Ranger deployment system whereby each of the City's largest regional parks will have dedicated coverage, as appropriate, in the recreational, environmental, and security areas. We support Management's request to authorized and fund thirty-eight (38) positions in the Park Ranger Program.

PERSONNEL and BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEES' REPORT relative to authority to set sworn retiree health subsidies.

Recommendation for Council action:
