<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: The Steering Committee reports that adoption of an ordinance and resolution of intention to levy the Proposition K: LA for Kids Assessment for Fiscal Year 2007-08 indicates the Council's intention to levy assessments totaling \$25 million to acquire and construct park and recreational facilities. The assessment can only be used for capital improvements, acquisition of land, administration, and maintenance. Staff costs associated with recreational programming are to be provided from the annual operating budgets of City departments or other entities. The order of magnitude estimate of the annual cost to the General Fund for the additional staffing and maintenance associated with the Five Year Plan, as reported by DRP, is approximately \$12.1 million in 2007 dollars, once all projects come on line.

The Steering Committee also reports that it has been provided with construction budget estimates for all projects anticipated to be funded in Year 11 (2007-08) by the BOE. The BOE reports that Proposition K funds, in combination with other funds where available, are sufficient to complete construction and meet all Proposition K obligations, without having an impact on the General Fund for Fiscal Year 2007-08.

- 4. INSTRUCT all bureaus and departments to reimburse the General Fund for any appropriate related costs as of June 30, 2007.
- 5. INSTRUCT all bureaus and departments to closely monitor their projects to ensure that the expenditures of funds for the purposes of each of these projects and that the expenditures of funds are correctly recorded and reported as such, and do not exceed the appropriations.
- 6. INSTRUCT all bureaus and departments to use the information in Attachment B of the March 20, 2007 LADOT report and attached to the Council file in requesting and reporting on expenditures of the Proposition C funds and TGF monies.
- 7. DIRECT the LADOT to provide front and matching funding for only those projects where the MTA has determined that the project meets MTA criteria for Proposition A or Proposition C Local Return Funding.
- 8. DIRECT the LADOT to provide front and matching funding for only those projects where the LADOT staff prepares the invoices for grant reimbursement.
- 9. AUTHORIZE the CAO to approve transfers within the TGF of up to 25 percent of the project amount, not to exceed \$117,000, to or between projects or accounts included in the May 18, 2007 CAO report as approved by the Mayor and Council.
- 10. INSTRUCT all bureaus and departments to return uncommitted advances at the end of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2006-07 and all prior year unexpended balances to the TGF Fund No. 655, to be reappropriated to their respective project accounts.
