The amount of recoverable costs for the MBID's 2007-08 operating year will be \$4,432.80 or four percent (three percent plus an additional one percent for processing of billing for a total of four percent) of the MBID's annual assessments revenue.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The City Administrative Officer reports that the LAMOTH will pay the City an annual rent of \$1. Additionally, the LAMOTH will be responsible for construction costs of the Holocaust Museum Project currently estimated at \$6 million. The LAMOTH will also be responsible for landscape, maintenance and operational costs associated with its operations of the Holocaust Museum Project. There is no impact on the General Fund.
