- 4. INSTRUCT the Bureau of Street Lighting to include in its Fiscal Year 08-09 budget submittal, more of these types of street lighting projects in an effort to reduce overtime costs associated with projects that are outside of the regular budget process.
- 5. REQUEST that the Mayor's Office report back to the Budget and Finance Committee with an explanation as to why Safer City Initiative funds are being used to fund this project rather than funding it through assessment districts.
- 6. AUTHORIZE the City Administrative Officer (CAO) to make technical corrections as necessary to this report to implement Mayor and Council intentions.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: The CAO reports that funds were appropriated in the 07-08 General City Purposes budget and there is no additional impact to the General Fund related to the installation of the lighting. The ongoing operation and maintenance of the lighting after installation will be paid through the Street Lighting Maintenance Assessment Fund (SLMAF). The SLMAF is currently subsidized by the General Fund in the amount of \$2,463,169. Pending an increase in assessments, increased expenditures by SLMAF for maintenance of the fixtures and \$260 per month in electricity costs will be borne by the General Fund.
