STATUTORY EXEMPTION and BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT relative to fee adjustments for the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) development review activities.

Recommendations for Council action:

1. FIND that the increase in fees is Statutorily Exempt as described by Section 5273 of Title 14 of California Code of Regulations Chapter 3 Guidelines for Implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act.
2. APPROVE the LADOT recommended adjustments in the Fees for Special Services to recover the cost of providing development services, establish other developer review fees, and to establish a traffic impact review fund.
3. REQUEST the City Attorney to prepare and present an ordinance to create Section 19.15 in the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) related to application fees paid to the LADOT for the preparation and processing of traffic reports in connection with obtaining environmental clearances.
4. ADOPT the LADOT's proposed method of adjusting these rates in the future as included in the attached proposed Ordinance, and as follows:
 - a. By May 1 of each odd numbered year, the Department shall provide a comprehensive study of fees for services, and shall provide a report and draft ordinance (Attachment A - attached to the Committee report) to the Mayor and the Council detailing any requested changes in the fees for special services for any particular item listed in Section 19.15.1 of the LAMC. The Comprehensive study shall include: (1) Measurement of the average salary increase in effect for all Transportation Planning staff members from the previous calendar year; (2) measurement of changes in material, equipment and contract costs

related to any and all fee for service items; (3) adjustment of any changes required in the amount of personnel time necessary to complete any said fee for service tasks; and, (4) current indirect costs for labor provided by the City's Cost Allocation Plan (CAP). Cost figures shall be compared to the current baseline established for each fee. Recommended fee changes shall be rounded to the nearest whole dollar. The recommended fee changes shall be requested to take effect beginning July 1 of the reporting year.

- b. By May 1 of each even numbered year, the Department shall provide a proposal for adjustment of fees for services, and shall provide a report and draft ordinance to the Mayor and the Council detailing any requested changes in the fees for service for any particular item listed in Section 19.15.1 of the LAMC. The adjustment shall include a measurement of the average salary increase in effect for all Transportation Planning staff members from the previous calendar year. Current indirect costs for labor from the City's CAP shall also be included as part of the adjustment and assessment report. Cost figures shall be compared to the current baseline established for each fee. Recommended fee changes shall be rounded to the nearest whole dollar. The recommended fee changes shall be requested to take effect beginning July 1 of the reporting year.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The LADOT reports that the recommended fees are listed in the attached table (Attachment B), which also provides cost and revenue information. If the proposed fee adjustments are approved, the Department anticipates an approximate increase in salaries recovered in excess of \$999,699 during the upcoming fiscal year, if current development trends continue.

The proposed fee increase will recover staff salaries for development review services for permit-issuance related activities. Staff time used for non-permit activities are not recoverable and are not part of this fee structure. In addition, \$26,874 (two percent of proposed fees) will be collected for the required materials and equipment to continue providing special services to the development community.

COMMUNICATION FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER relative to proposed Amendment No. 3 to Contract No. C-106467 with DMJM Design/Roth + Sheppard Joint Venture for the Police Administration Building - New Parker Center (PAB) Project for architectural and engineering design services.

Recommendations for Council action:

1. APPROVE Amendment No. 3 to Contract No. C-with DMJM Design/Roth + Sheppard Joint Venture to increase compensation by \$3,048,320 from \$14,900,000 to a maximum not-to-exceed compensation total of \$17,948,320 for architectural and engineering design services for the PAB Project subject to City Attorney approval.
2. AUTHORIZE the President of the Board of Public Works to execute Amendment No. 3 to Contract No. C-106467 with DMJM Design/Roth + Sheppard Joint Venture.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The City Administrative Officer reports that as approved by the Council and Mayor on November 6, 2007 (Council file No. 07-3498), the current budget for the PAB Project is approximately \$436.9 million, with financing from the Municipal Improvement Corporation of Los Angeles (MICLA), the Special Parking Revenue Fund and Proposition C, in the approximate amounts of \$411.8 million, \$23.9 million and \$1.1 million, respectively. The budget includes \$19 million in MICLA funding for architectural and engineering design services for all PAB project components, which is sufficient to provide funding up to the new contract ceiling specified in this amendment.

MICLA financing in the amount of up to \$500 million in lease revenue bonds was approved by Council on November 8, 2006 for both the Public Works Building and the PAB Project (Council file No. 06-2627). For the PAS component of the bond issuance, debt service averaging \$24.5 million of the bond issuance must be paid from the General Fund beginning in Fiscal Year 2010-11.

Once completed, the opening of the new Los Angeles Police Department headquarters and associated facilities may have an impact on the General Fund with regard to the costs of facility operation and maintenance. These costs may be offset as operations at existing facilities are reduced or stopped. The proposed amendment is not expected to result in an increase of operating and maintenance costs for the new facilities.
