Submit Brownfields Cleanup and Reuse grant applications to the EPA for the Hazardous Waste Cleanup Grant, \$200,000 for South Los Angeles Wetlands; Hazardous Waste Cleanup Grant, \$200,000 for East Wilmington Park; Petroleum Cleanup Grant, \$200,000 for a landscaped median Avalon Boulevard and Gage Avenue; Hazardous Substances Cleanup Grant, \$200,000 for 2750 East Washington Boulevard; or similar project sites within the City's Brownfields Program.
- b. Notify the Council if, and when, the City is awarded the EPA grants.
