<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: The CAO reports that the current Reserve Fund balance, prior to any transfers, is approximately \$244.3 million. Early reversion of \$18.2 million in disencumbered funds increases the Reserve Fund balance to \$262.5 million. Should the City Council and Mayor agree to deposit the \$18.2 million into the Budget Stabilization Fund, pending approval of the Budget Stabilization Fund Policy, the Reserve Fund will remain at \$244.3 million, or 5.37 percent of the General Fund, and the Budget Stabilization Fund will increase from \$0.5 million to \$18.7 million.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: The CAO reports that based on preliminary estimates, \$9.6 million in expenditure shortfalls and major unbudgeted expenses are identified in this report. No adjustment to budgeted revenue is recommended at this time. Transfers, appropriations and other adjustments totaling approximately \$96.8 million are recommended in Sections 1 and 2. Included in these recommendations is the re-authorization of \$22.4 million in Municipal Improvement Corporation of Los Angeles (MICLA) financing as per the 2012-13 Adopted Budget.

<u>Debt Impact Statement</u>: The CAO reports that the issuance of MICLA bonds is a General Fund obligation. In connection with the reauthorization to use MICLA financing provided for in the adopted budget, it is estimated that the City will need to borrow a total of \$24,973,000 (includes cost of equipment, costs of issuance, and debt service reserve fund) at a five percent interest rate. Actual interest rates may differ as rates are dependent on market conditions at the time of issuance. The CAO cannot predict what interest rates will be in the future. The total estimated debt service is \$32,039,000 which includes the borrowing amount and interest (\$7,066,000). During the life of the bonds, the estimated average annual debt service is \$3,204,000 over 10 years.
