<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: The WIB and CDD joint report states that the CDD budget includes City Central Services based on the preliminary 3.63 percent rate used in the original Annual Plan. Although the City's CAP 33 rate for Central Services was officially reduced from 3.63 percent to 0 percent, it should be noted that CAP 33 is applicable to PY 2010-11. The CAP 34 and 35 rates applicable for PYs 2011-12 and 2012-13, respectively, have not been finalized and approved as of the date of the issuance of this report. Therefore, pending issuance of the official rates, the Department budgeted and appropriated up to 3.63 percent for City Central Services.
