CDs 6, 8 HOUSING, COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE REPORT relative to funding from the Affordable Housing Trust Fund for various multifamily rental housing developments under the 2005 High Leverage Program Round 3.

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

- 1. AUTHORIZE the General Manager, Los Angeles Housing Department (LAHD), or designee, to:
  - a. Issue Letters of Commitment for the High Leverage Program with amounts identified from the Affordable Housing Trust Fund and other sources for the following projects, contingent on project sponsors applying to one or more of the following competitive programs: State of California Multifamily Housing Program (MHP), including the Multifamily Housing Supportive Service Program (MHSSP); California Tax Credit Allocation Committee (CTCAC) Low Income Housing Tax Credit Program, and U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Section 811 Capital Advance Program; and, receive the full amount requested from the identified leveraging source, as follows:

Negotiate and execute an acquisition, predevelopment, construction and permanent loan agreement for each project that receives an MHP/MHSSP or CTCAC funding award, subject to the satisfaction of all conditions and criteria stated in the HLP application, Letter of Commitment, and in any Council and Mayor approved actions.
- c. Execute subordination agreements wherein the City Ioan and regulatory agreements on Round Three projects are subordinated to all other project financing.
- d. Execute agreements allowing the transfer to and/or execution of loans by a limited partnership, to enable admittance of tax credit investors.
- e. Prepare Controller instructions and make any necessary technical adjustments consistent with this action, subject to the approval of City Administrative Officer (CAO); and AUTHORIZE the Controller to implement the instructions.

- 2. INSTRUCT the General Manager, LAHD, or designee, to:
  - a. Provide the necessary documentation or actions concerning satisfaction of environmental requirements prior to the release of any HLP funds, including the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), and either return to Mayor and Councilor withdraw funding commitments for any projects not meeting such requirements, inclusive of any conditions or requirements that substantially affect the terms of the HLP funding commitment.
  - b. Rescind the funding commitment awarded to Morgan Place Senior Apartments in 2005 Round Two of the HLP for an amount of \$2.7 million, in favor of the proposed commitment of \$2.9 million under 2005 Round Three.
- 3. AUTHORIZE the Controller, subject to full CEQA and NEPA environmental clearance, to:
  - a. Reimburse the sponsors of all Round Three approved projects for funding expenses incurred prior to the execution of City loans if such expenses have been approved by LAHD as part of the development cost budget.
  - b. Allocate and/or expend funds, as follows, upon proper written demand from the General Manager, LAHD, or designee:

Fiscal Impact Statement: The CAO reports that this action will not impact the General Fund. The above recommendations involve the use of dedicated funding sources to the Affordable Housing Trust Fund (\$451,000 in Community Redevelopment Agency funds) and \$6.3 million in Consolidated Plan HOME Investment Partnerships Program funds that supplement the Affordable Housing Trust Fund in support of the High Leverage Program, for total funding commitments of \$6.8 million. These recommendations are in compliance with City financial policies in that these are ongoing grant or special funds.
