06-0002-S59 (Zine - Smith) with the concurrence of the Mayor, that the City include in its 2005-06 Legislative Program, support of AB 2210 (Goldberg) or similar legislation or administrative action that would recast the law governing towing of vehicles to permit local authorities to require specific written authorization from the property owner or the lessee prior to removal of any vehicles, require towing companies to provide a photocopy of the written authorization to the vehicle owner or an agent of that owner prior to receipt of payment for towing and storage fees, prohibit towing companies from removing or commencing the removal of a vehicle unless the towing company has made a good faith inquiry to determine the statutory restrictions regarding the removal of the vehicle from certain private property, require towing companies to maintain certain records and to make violation of any of these provisions a misdemeanor and subject to civil action for up to four times the amount of the towing and storage charges.
