
The historic Broadway corridor is an important part of our City's past and future. The recently unveiled "Bringing Back Broadway" initiative is a public-private partnership which will help revitalize the historic Broadway corridor to ensure that the vibrant, cultural character of Broadway remains, while helping Broadway provide something for everyone, day and night. The revitalized historic Broadway corridor will complement and connect new large-scale downtown development projects, such as L.A. Live and Grand Avenue, as well as galleries, restaurants, and multi-cultural activities on Spring Street and throughout Downtown.

As Broadway experiences its welcomed and long-awaited renaissance, providing parking to support Broadway theater and commercial uses is of critical importance, and the City of Los Angeles should explore all options available, including public-private partnerships and creative and innovative mixed-use parking/retail/housing options.


I THEREFORE MOVE that the Chief Legislative Analyst immediately convene a City of Los Angeles departmental task force to include the Department of Transportation (DOT), Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA), the Bureau of Engineering (BOE), General Services Division (GSD), Los Angeles Housing Department (LAHD), Council District 14 (CD14) and others as necessary to address the need for new parking to serve Broadway and to maximize our parking potential in this community.

I FURTHER MOVE that this task force be directed to report back within 90 days outlining the various financing and development options.
