MOTION

The Community Redevelopment Board recently approved the Los Angeles Downtown Parking Management Ordinance Implementation Project Summary Report, which seeks to create a broad parking policy framework for downtown. This report is a culmination of consultant work begun in 2003 to identify and implement necessary parking management actions to contain congestion, promote and support viable, cost-effective automobile alternatives and promote revitalization and economic growth to Downtown. The report, however, does not include the quantitative analysis necessary to create a parking policy for downtown.


On October 18, 2005, Councilmember Perry introduced a motion (03-2669) to augment the existing CRA consultant contract to collect additional parking data in support of the Downtown Los Angeles Parking Management Ordinance Implementation Project. On November 23, 2005, the Council approved the transfer of \$156,114 of Special Parking Revenue Funds to the CRA to accommodate the revised scope of work. This work program has not yet been completed and the status is unknown.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Council direct the Department of Transportation to report to the Transportation Committee in 30 days on the status of implementing the parking data collection work program that would address critical institutional and technical parameters and the development of a detailed work program to create a Downtown Parking Information Management System, as previously approved by the Mayor and City Council on November 23, 2005 (CF#03-2669).

I FURTHER MOVE that the Department of Transportation be directed to report on the status of a transfer of \$156,114 from the Special Parking Revenue Fund to the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) to provide additional funding for critical activities supporting the Downtown Los Angeles Parking Management Ordinance Implementation Project, as previously approved by the Mayor and City Council on November 23, 2005 (CF#03-2669).

I FURTHER MOVE that the CRA report to the City Council with a timetable within which the quantitative study using the parking data will be completed.
