MEASURE B DISCUSSION HOSTED BY TOWN HALL LA AND LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS LA los Angeles, CA - Tuesday, February 17, 2009 - I OWN HALL Los Angeles and the League of Women Voters of Los Angeles will host a pre-election debate on Measure B "Green Energy and Good Jobs for Los Angeles Program," Tuesday, February 24, 2009 at the National Center for the Preservation of Democracy.

Panelists are Bill Corcaran, Senior Regional Representative, Sierra Club; Jack Humphreville, Representative, Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council; Ron Kaye, Blogger, Saving Los Angeles Project (SLAP); Bruce Khouri, Founder, Solar Integrated and H. David Nahai, CEO and General Manager, Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP). Moderating the debate will be KNBC-TV Reporter Conan Nolan.

The City of Los Angeles has a goal to generate at least 20% of its electricity from renewable sources, including solar, wind, geothermal, hydroelectric, and others. Measure B would require the Department of Water and Power (DWP) to develop a solar plan producing 400 megawatts of electric generation with timelines of implementation by 2014, a financing plan, lob trainina, participant education outreach, and incentives, least payments and rebates.

LADWP CEO H. David Nahai says DWP's NO.1 ranking by the Solar Electric Power Association (SEPA) "demonstrates our aggressive efforts to increase solar power in Los Angeles as part of our strong commitment to reducing the city's carbon footprint and increasing our supply of clean, green energy."

Ron Kaye on statistics indicating Measure B will increase electrical bills by only \$1 per month, "The plain truth is nobody knows. There are too many variables and Measure B doesn't define anything beyond giving DWP a monopoly on ownership, installation and maintenance of rooftop solar units."
