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CHW Community Grants Program Overview

PRIORITIES

Every Catholic Healthcare West (CHW) hospital has conducted a community health assessment and has identified strategic priorities based on this assessment. An objective of CHW's Community Grants Program is to award grants to nonprofit organizations whose proposals respond to the priorities identified in the health assessment and/or the community benefit plans of its hospitals.

CHW grant funds are to be used to provide services to underserved populations (economically poor; women and children; mentally or physically disabled; or other disenfranchised populations).

OBJECTIVES

In keeping with our strategic priorities, CHW encourages programs that integrate the following principles:

- Focus on disproportionate unmet health-related needs;
- Emphasize primary prevention and address underlying causes of health problems;
- Contribute to a seamless continuum of care;
- Build community capacity; and
- Emphasize collaborative governance.

CRITERIA

- Funding up to \$25,000. Due to availability of funds, individual hospitals may reduce the \$25,000 limit;
- Strict adherence to grant guidelines is expected; and
- Proposals must identify the type of change expected, and how and over what time period progress will be measured.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization or have a fiscal agent that is a 501(c)(3) organization and capable of administering the project's funds;
- Project or program must be a response to the health priorities identified in your local CHW hospital's community health assessment or benefit plan; and
- Project to be funded must involve collaboration with other organizations and/or with a CHW hospital in your community.

LETTER OF INTENT

All prospective applicants are asked to submit a Letter of Intent, which should briefly describe the organization and the project. For an outline of the Letter of Intent, see the Catholic Healthcare West website at www.chwHEALTH.org/communitygrants.

FULL PROPOSAL
