ZINE INTRODUCES REWARD MOTION RELATIVE TO NOTORIOUS B.I.G.

(Los Angeles) - Seeking to encourage the public to provide information on the Christopher Wallace case, Councilman Dennis P. Zine introduced a reward motion on Friday in the sum of \$50,000.

The original reward motion, written in 1997 and introduced by Council President John Ferraro, expired after 60 days. Zine's reward motion reinstates the original 1997 reward motion for an additional 60 days and offers \$50,000 for information related to the investigation, instead of the original \$25,000.

"The Christopher Wallace case was, and continues to be, a high profile case in the City of Los Angeles," said Zine, a 37 year veteran of the Los Angeles Police Department and acting Reserve Police Officer. "I am hopeful someone will come forward with information which will lead the to the eventual apprehension of the murderers involved in this case."

This motion has been referred to the Public Safety Committee of the City Council for review and discussion.
