Councilmember Zine Takes Action to Replace the Reseda Park Pool

(Los Angeles) – On Wednesday, November 19th, Councilman Dennis P. Zine introduced a motion to have various City Departments report to the Arts, Parks, Health, and Aging Committee with a project analysis, timeline, preliminary cost estimates, and potential funding sources necessary to repair the Reseda Park Pool located at 18411 Victory Boulevard in Reseda.

At the beginning of the 2008 Recreation and Parks seasonal pool operations, leaks were discovered in the filtered water return line at the Reseda Pool. After these repairs were completed, a larger pipe rupture was discovered rendering the pool inoperable. It was determined that a full replacement is necessary to utilize the Reseda Pool location.

“We must do everything in our power to get this pool up and running,” said Councilman Zine. “This community facility is too important to the children of this neighborhood to lose it permanently. The Reseda pool has given San Fernando Valley residents relief from the heat for 78 years and we want to ensure that it will give the community at least 78 more.”

There are many steps that must be taken to initiate this project; a geo-technical survey, feasibility study, scope of work, design, and public hearings must be conducted. And every source of potential funding must be identified. Councilman Zine has asked that the Department of Recreation and Parks, Bureau of Engineering, Chief Legislative Analyst, and City Administrative Office report to the Committee with a plan to commence this rebuilding project.

This motion was referred to the Arts, Parks, Health, and Aging Committee.
