CITY COUNCIL APPROVES \$50,000 REWARD MOTION FOR INFORMATION LEADING TO THE IDENTIFICATION, CAPTURE AND CONVICTION OF THE HIT-AND-RUN KILLER OF 28 YEAR-OLD JUDY RAMOS

Los Angeles, CA – Today, the Los Angeles City Council unanimously approved a motion introduced by Councilmember Richard Alarcón to create a \$50,000 reward for information that leads to the identification, capture and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the hit-and-run death of 28 year-old San Fernando resident, Judy Ramos. Judy was crossing the street at 12:15 AM on the morning of July 19th, traveling back from the store with her mother, when she was hit by a vehicle that is described only as a white four-door vehicle. There is no driver description.

“As a father that has lost his own son in a traffic accident, I know first hand the pain and grief a family goes through when a child’s life is taken from them,” said Councilmember Alarcón. “Judy was only 28 years-old when she was cut down in the prime of her life. I urge anyone that thinks they might know something about this tragic crime to please step forward, to help bring closure to the family and a conclusion to this tragic investigation.”

Because of the lack of solid leads in the case, the Los Angeles Police Department asked Councilmember Richard Alarcón to introduce this motion to create a \$50,000 reward for information that will lead to the identification, capture and conviction of the person or persons responsible for this horrible crime. The public is asked to help locate additional witnesses, the hit-and-run vehicle or the driver.
