- a. <u>Motion to approve</u> a letter and CIS from ASNC protesting the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment's (DONE) treatment of the Hollywood Studio District Neighborhood Council, attempting to compel them to fund an event they did not support. DONE, according to the Los Angeles City Charter, is required to ASSIST the Neighborhood Councils, not control them or spend their funds without their approval.
- b. <u>Motion to approve</u> a letter from ASNC to Council District 1 and the Department of Recreation and Parks to work with local leaders to seek funds to satisfy the monetary encumbrances incurred by North East Trees, so that the Department can accept the gift of Flat Top open space as parkland in perpetuity as intended in 2014 by Supervisor Gloria Molina. In addition to the monetary issues, local community members in collaboration with CD1 and the Department will identify a new, competent, fiscally responsible custodian of the property.
