- b. Motion to approve a \$5000 Neighborhood Purposes Grant (NPG) to Avenue 50 Studio in support events through the end of 2023 held at Ramona Hall, Montecito Heights Rec Center and Carlin G Center in Mt. Washington, all facilities vital to the surrounding ASNC communities. The funds will be used for food gift cards, small toys, grocery bags with dry and canned food, fresh fruits and vegetables. Also included is food for volunteers and the events.
- c. <u>Motion to Approve</u> \$1000 in Outreach funds for an NPG for Through Peace for the production of the booklet How to Report a Hate Crime to empower vulnerable communities.

- b. <u>Motion to approve</u> ASNC CIS to acting GM of DONE for assistance in finding appropriate spaces to meet, and to immediately convene an open meeting to brainstorm ideas on addressing finding and securing facilities as directed by <u>Council File 02-0090</u> approved on October 29, 2002:
 - 1. INSTRUCT all City departments to offer meeting facilities to NCs free of charge for official City meetings; and,
 - 2. INSTRUCT the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment to develop a listing of every meeting room in every City facility and make the list available to certified NCs.
- c. <u>Motion to approve</u> Subject to the Governor's approval of <u>Senate Bill 411</u>, the Arroyo Seco NC elects to use teleconferencing for some or all of its Board and/or Committee meetings pursuant to Government Code Section 54953.8.(a)(2)(B)
- d. Motion to approve sending a letter to the Planning Dept opposing the project at 4504 Jessica, 90065 as presented due to front yard setback and potential impact on height, and lack of adequate information such as roadway width and highway dedication. Letter to be held pending return of applicant on October 12th and sent if issues have not been resolved
- e. <u>Motion to approve</u> sending a letter to the Planning Dept in opposition to the project at 4126 Sea View Av., 90065, stating that the project shows sensitive design, is well within zoning limits and the exterior is consistent with the historic tradition of the design, however the issue is the non-compliant roadway width. Letter to be held pending return of applicant on October 12th and sent if issues have not been resolved.
