VIRTUAL MEETING TELECONFERENCING NUMBER FOR PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

In conformity with the November 1, 2023, enactment of California Senate Bill SB 411 (Portantino) On October 8, 2023 Governor Gavin Newsom signed SB 411 into law, which modifies the Brown Act to authorize eligible legislative bodies, including Los Angeles Neighborhood Councils, to use teleconferencing for their meetings. November 9, 2023 (date adopted), The AVNC Board at a Brown Act noticed public meeting was held by this NC with a quorum of 14 board members present and that by a vote of 13 yes, 0 no, and 1 ineligible adopted the following resolution: Whereas, this resolution is the official statement adopted by this Neighborhood Council. The Atwater Village NC satisfies the ²/₃ board requirement of SB 411 and approves meeting virtually for board and/or committee meetings because using teleconferencing will allow for increased community participation, as well as allow for more time to discuss important issues, as well as help protect the health and safety of our board members and stakeholders.





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This Atwater Village Neighborhood Council committee meeting will be conducted entirely with a call-in option or internet-based service option.
