 - b. The CHNC approves a CIS in favor of <u>CF 25-694</u>, a motion to request the City Attorney to prioritize immediate legal action to protect the civil rights of our residents and to seek injunctive relief from unconstitutional searches, seizures, and detentions.
 - c. The CHNC approves a CIS in favor of <u>CF 25-696</u>, a motion requesting the City Attorney present an ordinance limiting the use of crowd control weapons, including public transparency, civil recourse, and agency oversight.
 - d. The CHNC approves a CIS in favor of <u>CF 25-697</u>, to protect constitutional rights (especially Fourth Amendment protections) of all Angelenos and ensure that LAPD actions are transparent, legally constrained, and do not undermine the City's Sanctuary City commitments.
