Board Member Attendance Requirements per ENC Bylaws: Article V Governing Board, Section 7: Absences Any Representative who misses a total of four (4) regularly scheduled Board meetings during any twelve (12) month period beginning after the most recent Board election will be automatically removed from the Board. Each Representative absence shall be recorded in the Council's meeting minutes or other manner of Council record keeping, and, upon missing the required number of Board meetings for removal, the Council Presiding officer shall notify the Representative and provide notice to that Representative that their seat has been declared vacant. After the seat is declared vacant, the Department shall be notified and the websites modified to remove said Representative from the list of board members. Any regular meeting of the Board, scheduled and noticed as per the Brown Act, shall constitute a meeting for the purpose of determining Representative attendance.

6. NEW BUSINESS - FUNDING:

- **A.** <u>Motion:</u> The ENC Board approves the expenditure of \$1000.00 to fund and participate in the annual OneGeneration Senior Symposium on Saturday, May 17, 2025. The event is free and open to the public. <u>Invoice</u> This is an Outreach Category expense.

Discussion: Council File: 15-0989-S47 City Council has a motion that seeks to: "exempt Olympic and Paralympic temporary and permanent venues, training facilities, security perimeters, broadcast and media centers, transit infrastructure, live sites and fan zones, and associated structures from the requirements of City Planning approvals, zoning regulations, and conditions, including but not limited to Conditional Use Permits and conditions tied to such permits, Site Plan Review requirements, height restrictions, setback requirements, limitations imposed by Specific Plans, and any other planning or zoning regulations that could delay or impede the rapid deployment and or use of

essential facilities; and related matters." It will also exempt developments from the California Environmental Quality Act.

IN CONFORMITY WITH THE OCTOBER 6, 2023 ENACTMENT OF CALIFORNIA SENATE BILL 411 (PORTANTINO) AND LA CITY COUNCIL APPROVAL ON NOVEMBER 1, 2023, THE ENCINO NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL MEETING WILL BE CONDUCTED VIRTUALLY.

Consent items which have been unanimously approved by a public committee meeting are exempted unless pulled from the consent section by a Board member.

SB 411 Updates:

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1.

- (C) The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time.
- (D) Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate.
- (E) (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.
- (ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.
- (iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.
