- 10. **Consent Calendar** (Consent items are voted on together by one vote. Consent items can be pulled for discussion or separate vote.)
 - A. Council File 25-1142 This council file seeks a comprehensive analysis of the resources needed to bring core programs that maintain and repair the City's public right-of-way infrastructure to industry standards or best practices set by the City. According to the Motion, the City spends tens of millions annually on legal settlements for injuries tied to broken sidewalks, unstable hillsides, fallen trees, and unrepaired streetlights, which could be used to perform preventive.

MOTION: ENC Public Safety Committee recommends submitting a CIS supporting CF 25-1142.

B. Council File 20-0190 – ENC Public Safety Committee recommends submitting a CIS supporting CF 20-0190. And denouncing Councilmember Raman's vote against this, because of the dangers in the Sepulveda Basin which are a significant concern to our community. This council file seeks to allow Park Rangers to be armed; Park Rangers receive the same law enforcement training and firearms training as LAPD. Plus, they often have additional training in areas like fire and rescue, search and rescue, wildland firefighting, and specialized expertise in the extensive trails and terrain of city parks.

ENC previously unanimously approved a CIS in support of this on 12/8/21.

MOTION: ENC Public Safety Committee recommends submitting a CIS supporting CF 20-0190.

C. <u>Council File 25-1083</u> – This council file instructs the Department of City Planning, Transportation Department, and the Housing Department, in consultation of the City Attorney, and Chief Legislative Analyst, to prepare a report in 90 days on an assessment detailing the impacts of SB79.

MOTION: ENC PLU Committee recommends submitting a CIS supporting CF 25-1083.

D. Council File CF 25-1138 – This council file instructs the Chief Legislative Analyst to commission a study within 30 days on the effects of establishing a Residential Constructive Minimum Wage for all mid-sized residential construction in the City of \$32.35 an hour, plus an additional healthcare credit of \$7.65 per hour, which shall increase annually thereafter based on the Consumer Price Index.

MOTION: ENC PLU Committee recommends submitting a CIS supporting CF 25-1138.

SB 411 Updates:

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1.

- (C) The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time.
- (D) Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate.
- (E) (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph
- (D), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.
- (ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.
- (iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.
