ii. Bi-monthly notifications from Planning regarding new applications are copied and shared with PLUC. Any other sources of information germane to planning in Glassell Park is shared with PLUC.

- iii. All information submitted will be placed on the PLUC monthly agenda for committee follow-up.
- iv. Outreach about projects on the PLUC agenda, other than posted on social media, is by mailings from the representatives of the projects and by 11 x 17 posters taped around the project area and neighborhood.
- v. The posters are created after it is confirmed that a project will be on the agenda. Theposter requires the project address, contact person(s) and their contact information, a link to the City Planning site for the project and a map locating the project. The poster also contains the date, time and location of the PLUC meeting. A QR code needs to be created for the Planning link. A QR code is also needed if meeting is virtual.
- vi. Posters are printed at Alco Printing and are picked up when ready.

- vii. Posters are taped around the project site and neighborhood at least 5 days in advance."
