f) A quorum for a committee is the simple majority of its membership, and recommendations shall be made by majority vote of those present, with a record of the vote made by the recorder. Votes other than unanimous shall be by roll call.

g) All Committee rosters shall be posted on the GPNC website, together will email contact information for the chairperson of

each committee, and agendas and minutes of committees shall be forwarded by the Committee Chairs to the GPNC webmaster for inclusion on the website.

h) All Committee meetings must be posted on the GPNC website calendar by the Committee Chairs.
