Oral public comment for agenda items is limited to 1 minute per item for a total of 3 minutes. Oral public comment on non-agenda items is limited to 1 minute. Total oral public comment may not exceed 4 minutes per speaker, unless allowed by the chair. Commenters are encouraged (but not required) to fill out a public comment speaker card prior to speaking.

PUBLIC ACCESS OF RECORDS: In compliance with Government Code §54957.5, non-exempt writings distributed to a majority or all of the Board in advance of a meeting may be reviewed on the council's website or during normal library business hours (library reference desk). PROCESS FOR RECONSIDERATION: The council may reconsider and amend its action on items listed here if that reconsideration takes place immediately following the original action, or at the next regular meeting. The Council, on either of these two days shall: 1) Make a Motion for reconsideration and, if approved, 2) hear the matter and take an action. If the motion to reconsider an action is to be scheduled at the next meeting following the original action, then two items shall be placed on the agenda for that meeting: 1) A Motion for Reconsideration on the described matter and 2) a [Proposed] Action should the motion to reconsider be approved. A motion for reconsideration can only be made by a member who has previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action. If a motion for reconsideration is not made on the date the action was taken, then a member on the prevailing side of the action must submit a motion to the Chair or Secretary identifying the matter to be reconsidered and a brief description of the reason(s) for requesting reconsideration at the next regular meeting. The aforesaid shall all be in compliance with the Ralph M. Brown Act governing public entities.
