a. **From Lindsey Nelson, HLP Neighbor and Undocumented Immigrant Activist:**

"There is an upcoming HUD rule change on mixed-immigration-status families that could be devastating to Highland Park.

The public comment period ends on 4/20, and organizers are still far short of their goal. When this rule was previously proposed, it was successfully delayed with 30,000 public comments. The goal this time is 60,000, but currently, there are barely over 2,000 public comments.

First and foremost, this rule change would increase the interactions between immigrant community members and DHS, likely resulting in more detentions, deportations, and devastated families. This rule change could affect a large number of mixed-status families living in Highland Park and could also have a net negative impact on housing availability and affordability in our community. The only winners are landlords and developers.

I'd be happy to chat more about it if you'd like. I'll link below to an org working on fighting this rule change. If you're allowed, it would be great if the HHPNC could do public outreach about this."
