#### **NHWNC Board Members:**

- 1. Call to order and Welcome by the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment (DONE).
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance and Roll Call.
- 3. Selections for open Board positions for the North Hills West Neighborhood Council. Bylaws Arrival V NHWNC BYLAWS; ARTICLE V GOVERNING BOARD P. 6: "The Board shall consist of thirteen (13) Stakeholders elected by their peers (Stakeholders) and/or selected or appointed by the Board. The NHWNC values the diversity of its Stakeholders. This diversity shall be reflected in the election, selection, and appointment process. Currently, the NHWNC does not have the ability to achieve quorum. There are currently six board members, and per the NHWNC Bylaws, seven is required for quorum of a Board meeting. This meeting is a special board meeting happening to satisfy the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners's (BONC) Loss of Quorum Policy. The meeting will be run by the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment. The composition of the Board shall be as follows:
  - i. **Residential Stakeholder Board Members** (7) Open to Stakeholders eighteen (18) years of age or older who live in a residence, either as a homeowner or a renter, within the boundaries of the NHWNC and must provide proof of residency.

- ii. **General Stakeholder Board Members** (5) Open to Stakeholders eighteen (18) years of age or older who own a business or property, or work within the boundaries of NHWNC and provide proof of such. These positions are also open to Stakeholders who participate in a community organization such as but not limited to religious institution, educational institution, community based organization, non-profit organization, neighborhood association, school/parent group, faith based group, senior group, youth group, arts association, service organization, boys or girls club, cultural group, or environmental group within the NHWNC boundaries and provide proof of consistent, active membership of said group.
  - iii. **Community Interest Stakeholder** (1) Open to Stakeholders eighteen (18) years of age or older who declare a stake in the neighborhood as a community interest stakeholder, defined as a person who affirms a substantial and ongoing participation with a community organization that has continuously maintained a physical street address for not less than one year, and that performs ongoing and verifiable activities and operations that benefit the neighborhood, and is located within the NC's boundaries. A for-profit entity shall not qualify as a Community Organization.
    - a. Discussion and possible action to appoint one stakeholder to fill one of the vacancies on the North Hills West Neighborhood Council (NHWNC) Board. Per the Loss of Quorum Policy, from the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners, only one seat shall be filled at this meeting. This is because according to the NHWNC Bylaws, appointing a stakeholder to one vacant seat will raise the seats filled on the NHWNC Board from six to seven, therefore allowing the NHWNC Board to make quorum for future Board meetings. The NHWNC is currently seeking one (1) Residential Board Member, Seat term expiring 2025; one (1) General Board Member, Seat term expiring 2027; two (2) General Board Members, Seat terms expiring 2027; and one (1) Community Board Member, Seat expiring 2027.
      - a. Each stakeholder must verify their stakeholder status through documentation. See "2023 Neighborhood Council Elections Documentation Guide" for more information on how to qualify for a seat on the Board. Also, see NHWNC Bylaws for information on Board seats and more about the NHWNC Board.
      - b. The Board will vote on who they believe to be the best candidate, and the candidate with the most votes will win.
      - c. The Department of Neighborhood Empowerment (DONE) will confirm their selection.

### 4. Adjournment
