PAIP Vision Statement

These Public Access Investment Plan funds should be used to mitigate negative impacts caused by the Port of Los Angeles on the surrounding communities in San Pedro and Wilmington. Projects should not include those that are serving the Port's existing operations or those of its current or future tenants but should focus on benefiting the surrounding community. Furthermore, these projects must have a nexus to the Port of Los Angeles but need not be located immediately on or adjacent to the Port. Such projects should have a positive impact on the surrounding environment to mitigate against the many forms of pollution resulting from the Port's activities and past actions. As capital improvement projects are approved, the source, timeline and mechanism for the funds and personnel responsible for maintaining that project in perpetuity should be communicated before the project is finalized. The review, recommendations and approval process for these projects should be an example of how to best engage the public in an inclusive and meaningful way. To be clear the PAIP projects need to go beyond any court ordered settlements, regulated environmental enforcements or other capital improvement projects that would normally be funded out of the port's general revenue funds.
