In conformity with the October 6, 2023, enactment of California Senate Bill 411 (Portantino) and LA City Council approval on November 1, 2023, this meeting will be conducted virtually.

The quorum for Panorama City Neighborhood Council Board of Directors meetings is eleven. Public comments on agenda items will be heard when the item is considered. Public comments on other matters within the committee's jurisdiction may be made during the Public Comment period. Public comments are limited to two minutes per speaker or less if declared by the Chair. Action may be taken on any agenda item except Public Comment, announcements and reports. You may request a copy of printed materials that are distributed at the meeting. You may record the meeting by audio, video or photographic means if it is not disruptive. Meeting notices and agendas are posted at Plaza del Valle, Community Room (see below). If you need translation, or accommodation for a disability, please call the city Department of Neighborhood Empowerment at least three business days in advance (213-978-1551, or toll-free 3-1-1). The city is a covered entity under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act. If you believe the council is not following the law or its own rules you may file a grievance in writing with copies to both the Chair and the Secretary. - 0:00 5. **Fill vacant seats and Alternate positions and possibly Youth Advisors by appointment.** Despite the 2025 election, this Neighborhood Council still has vacant seats and Alternate positions. (Please see the letterhead.) A new election may or may not be held in 2027, depending on the city budget. Filling current open positions is critical to continued ability to achieve a quorum.

- 0:00 7. **Discussion and possible action for approval of any financial statements, Monthly Expenditure Reports (MER's), or other ongoing monthly financial documents prepared by the Treasurer or Finance Chair which have not yet been approved by the Board, along with consideration of remedial actions to meet the council's financial responsibilities and debts.** At the time this agenda was prepared, the City Clerk had "frozen" council funds for failure to upload the Board Action Form showing the approval of two earlier MERs at the February meeting.
- 0:00 8. **Discussion and possible action on the request of the Outreach committee for up to \$1000 for an "identification package" including name badges, business cards and polo shirts with PCNC identification plus a supply of T-shirts with PCNC identification for use by board members and volunteers during cleanups and other public service activities.**
- 0:00 9. **Discussion and possible action to approve a revised Administrative Packet (which includes the annual budget) for the current 2025-2026 Fiscal Year, if it is necessary to do so. (Funds may need to be moved to match expenditures, including the identification package considered under item 8.) and make any changes to the financial officers and signers that may also be considered under this item.**
- The budget and the recurring operations expense information can be revised at any time by a Board vote, monthly if needed.

- 0:00 12. **Discussion and possible action on recommendation of the Rules Committee that the Board adopt and approve a Standing Rules document with rules and policies as approved at the February meeting, provided that the text is made available to board members at least 24 hours before this meeting.** Items approved in concept at the February meeting include the committee quorum of three, the process for naming and approving committee members, the board process for approving urgent operations or outreach expenses that arise between meetings, and the role and selection of Youth Advisors to the Board.
- 0:00 13. **Discussion and possible action to revise the bylaws to (1) remove the 30 day posting notice required for posting bylaws revisions before a second final vote can be taken (this change to Article XIII was approved at the February meetings) and (2) revise Article X (Elections) to allow the council to conduct its own board 'selection' (by show of hands at a town hall meeting or by casting non-secret numbered ballots) in lieu of an 'election' held by the City Clerk.** There may be NO ELECTION in 2027 due to the city's financial crisis. This would cause difficulty in the Neighborhood Council because it elects half of its board at each annual election. 'Selections' are an alternative to City Clerk elections, are managed by the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment, and have been run successfully by other council such as Chatsworth. **The deadline for submitting bylaws changes for approval is currently *April 1*, but the The**

Department of Neighborhood Empowerment has extended the deadline to *May 1* if a council is choosing to make a bylaws change to enable a 'selection' process.

TELECOMMUNICATIONS MEETING INSTRUCTIONS AND PUBLIC COMMENT

In conformity with the January 1, 2026 enactment of California Senate Bill 707 (Durazo) and LA City Council file 23-1114, Neighborhood Council meetings may be conducted virtually if the Board takes action to choose this option for its meetings.

Every person wishing to address the Board must dial the Zoom dial-in number listed in the agenda title and enter the Zoom meeting ID number listed in the agenda title and then press # to join the meeting. When prompted by the presiding officer, to provide public input at the Neighborhood Council meeting the public will be requested to dial *9 if on telephone or use the Raise Hand option in an online Zoom meeting to address the Board on any agenda item before the Board takes an action on an item. Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered.

Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to ____ minutes per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. California

Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(3).

The legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(4).

Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(5),

A legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to paragraph (5), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(A),

A legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to paragraph (5), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(B).

Notice to Paid Representatives:

If you are compensated to monitor, attend, or speak at this meeting, City law may require you to register as a lobbyist and report your activity. See Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 48.01 et seq. Council Process: The council gained its official city role upon certification by the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners on March 15, 2007. Everyone who lives, works or owns real property within the boundaries of the Panorama City Neighborhood Council, or who declares a Community Interest in the area and the basis for it, is a "stakeholder". All stakeholders are members of the Council. Stakeholders elect a Board of Directors to represent them. This Board is recognized as the decision-making entity by the City of Los Angeles. The current Board was elected in Spring, 2025. The next election is planned for Spring, 2027. While the Board is the official decision-making entity, meetings are conducted as much as possible in a town hall spirit. Committees are open to anyone with an interest in Panorama City. Panorama City's neighborhood council is much more than its Board, and it depends on public participation for its success.

Posting Sites: California's open meetings law, the Ralph M. Brown Act, requires that meeting notices be physically posted at a regular location 72 hours in advance for regular meetings and 24 hours in advance for special meetings. The location must be accessible to the public seven days a week, 24 hours a day. That location is the outside windows or steel doors of the Plaza Del Valle Community Room, Building G, 8700 Van Nuys Boulevard, Panorama City, CA 91402. This council is also required to follow the City of Los Angeles posting policy for Neighborhood Councils. That policy additionally requires that councils post agendas through the city's Early Notification System (ENS), post the agendas on the council's website (if one exists), and make an effort to send agendas by electronic mail (if such a list exists). This council posts agendas on its website, panoramacitync.org. This council uses the city's ENS mailing list as its agenda email list. In addition to the Plaza Del Valle posting location, this council MAY post agendas at other locations within Panorama City. These may include: (1) Panorama City Branch Library, 14345 Roscoe Boulevard; (2) Panorama Recreation Center, 8600 Hazeltine Avenue; (3) Sepulveda Recreation Center, 8801 Kester Avenue; and (4) Casa Esperanza, 14705 Blythe Street. In addition to the ENS agenda list, this council MAY include agendas in its occasional informational emails. You can subscribe to the council's informational email list by sending your request to 'info@panoramacitync.org'. You can also sign up on the council's website. In order to respect our stakeholders' inboxes, messages to the informational email list will be sent at most once or twice a month. *The only way to assure that you will receive emailed agendas is through the ENS list.*
