Every person wishing to address the Board must dial 669.900.6833, and enter 851 6123 2288 and then press # to join the meeting. When prompted by the presiding officer, to provide public input at the Neighborhood Council meeting the public will be requested to dial *9 or use the Raise Hand option, to address the Board on any agenda item before the Board takes an action on an item. Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered.

Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to two minutes per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

SB 411 Updates:

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1.

- (C) The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time.
- (D) Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate.
- (E) (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.
 - (ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity

to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.

(iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.

As recommended by the PSHT Committee, discussion and possible action to recommend to the Executive Committee to agendize for the December 16 General Board meeting to consider approving an update to the community impact statement for Council File 23-0600-S121 that the board approved on August 19, 2025. Philip wants the board to discuss an update to the community impact statement that he submitted on November 28 for a December 2 meeting of the Budget and Finance Committee.

On August 27, the Transportation Committee continued this item to a date to be determined. The RVNC submitted a community impact statement for this council file on September 16 and that describes a systemic failure of the existing policies and procedures which allowed a developer to close a critically important sidewalk during a period of two weeks, leaving numerous middle school students stranded without a safe alternate route to school. However, on September 17, LADOT explained their policies and procedures in a way that suggests construction contractors may reasonably be allowed to self-regulate in this context.

- 11. As recommended by the PSHT Committee, discussion and possible action to recommend to the Executive Committee to agendize for the December 16 General Board meeting: 1) to consider reviewing and supporting LAPD's Immigration Frequently Asked Questions handbook in English and Spanish titled <u>"The Los Angeles Police Department: Community Policing and Immigration: A guide to LAPD's policies;"</u> and 2) to consider approving a proposed community impact statement for Council File <u>25-0697</u>, Law Enforcement Agency / Assistance Request / Los Angeles Police Department Response / Angeleno Constitutional Rights.
- 12. As recommended by the PSHT Committee, discussion and possible action to recommend approval of a community impact statement regarding Council File <u>23-1134</u>, Economic Roundtable / Economic Study / Annual Rent Increase / Rent Stabilization Ordinance (RSO) / Sole-Source Contract.

As recommended by the PSHT Committee, discussion and possible action to agendize for the December 16 General Board meeting to approve a community impact statement regarding Council File <u>21-1230-S8</u>, Citywide Code Amendment (CA) / Environmental Clearance (EIR) / Resident Protections Ordinance (Los Angeles City Planning Commission): Introduced October 17, 2024 and referred to Planning and Land Use Management Committee. Los Angeles City Planning Commission report is relative to the Citywide Code Amendment and Environmental Clearance for the proposed <u>Resident Protections Ordinance</u>.
- 14. As recommended by the PSHT Committee, discussion and possible action to agendize for the December 16 General Board meeting recommend approval of a community impact statement regarding Council File 23-1210, Leading Pedestrian Intervals (LPI) / Vision Zero Safety Study / Signal Phasing and Timing / Traffic Violence. Motion passed on January 10, 2024, City Council to INSTRUCT the Department of Transportation to report back, within 120 days, with draft updated guidelines for the use of Leading Pedestrian Intervals (LPI), scramble crosswalks, and NO RIGHT TURN ON RED restrictions, taking into account the appropriateness of longer LPI duration, a more liberal set of criteria for scramble crosswalks, and increased usage of restricting right turns on red to reduce vehicle-pedestrian conflicts.
- 15. As recommended by the PSHT Committee, discussion and possible action to agendize for the December 16 General Board meeting to approve a community impact statement regarding Council File 25-0481, Bicycle and Multi Use Paths / Maintenance Responsibility / Department of Public Works / Los Angeles Administrative Code / Amendment. The Council to REQUEST that the City Attorney, in consultation with the Department of Public Works (DPW) and its bureaus, to prepare and present an ordinance amending the Los Angeles Administrative Code to assign the responsibility for maintaining City bicycle and multiuse paths to the Department of Public Works and INSTRUCT the City Administrative Officer, with the cooperation of DPW and the Department of Transportation, to provide recommendations regarding alignment of staffing and funding to provide an adequate level of maintenance for bicycle and multi-use paths, at least equal to that provided to streets and sidewalks.
- 16. As recommended by the PSHT Committee, discussion and possible action to agendize for the December 16 General Board meeting to approve a community impact statement regarding Council File <u>25-0558</u>, Bicycle Lane / Parking Violations / Cameras / Automated Technology / Pilot Program / Hollywood Boulevard / Council District 13. Council to instruct the Department of Transportation to report on the feasibility of implementing a pilot project that would utilize cameras and related technologies for the enforcement of parking violations in bicycle lanes, along Hollywood Boulevard in Council District 13, in accordance with the California Vehicle Code Section 40245.
- 17. As recommended by the PSHT Committee, discussion and possible action to agendize for the December 16 General Board meeting to approve a community impact statement regarding Council File <u>25-0930</u>: Departments of Transportation and City Planning in coordination with Bureau of Street Services and the Bureau of Engineering, to report on options and recommendations that would require bike lanes to provide sufficient width for emergency vehicle access. CD 13 with CD4 and 5 amended the emergency vehicles/bike lane width motion to have report backs on the issue of required widths and safety: <u>amending motion here</u>.
