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7. Motion recommending repair of fencing at Alma Park.

Coastline and Parks, and Sunken City ad hoc Committees

Whereas, the Alma park boundary fence adjacent to and north of 926 and 922 W 22nd street and north of the alley and 2117 S. Meyler Street is in a state of disrepair and has been for more than a decade, and

Whereas this creates a hazard for property damage, illegal dumping, and enables vandalism and crime, and

Whereas the former Alma Park advisory board and the current Alma Park neighborhood community organization, at least since 2015, have requested that this situation be remediated,

Therefore be it resolved, the Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council urges the Department of Recreation and Parks to immediately act to stabilize the area and replace the fence,

Further resolved, the Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council urges the Department of Recreation and Parks to engage with the Neighborhood Council during the process to gain the benefit of public input.

8. Motion recommending "Coastal Savings Clause" to be included in all State housing and land use bills.

Land Use, Planning, and Transportation Committee

Whereas, the "Coastal Savings Clause" is typically included in state housing and land use legislation, which states:

This section does not supersede or in any way alter or lessen the effect or application of the California Coastal Act of 1976 (Division 20, commencing with Section 30000, of the Public Resources Code)

and

Whereas, without a "Coastal Savings Clause", proposed Assembly Bill 1287 (Density Bonus) and Assembly Bill 2097 (parking) would essentially result in no protections of community character or minimum requirements for parking in the Coastal Zone,

Resolved, Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council strongly recommends that the City include a request in its 2023 State Legislative Program for the "Coastal Savings Clause" to be included in all state bills involving housing or land use in the Coastal Zone, including but not limited to currently proposed Assembly Bill 1287 (Density Bonus) and Assembly Bill 2097 (parking).

9. Motion recommending conditional support of project at 3330 Peck Ave (DIR-2023-68-CDP-MEL-HCA).

Land Use, Planning, and Transportation Committee

Resolved, Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council recommends approval of the project at 3330 Peck Ave, City Case No. DIR-2023-68-CDP-MEL-HCA, for a conversion from an existing 436 square foot portion of a 2-car garage and an existing 351 square foot storage space to two new Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) within a 13-unit apartment building, *only if* the one parking space in the garage that is being removed can be replaced by removing the curb cut, to increase street parking.

10. Motion recommending support of project at 3337 Denison Ave (DIR-2023-147-CDP-MEL-HCA).

Land Use, Planning, and Transportation Committee

Resolved, Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council recommends approval of the project at 3337 Denison Ave, City Case No. DIR-2023-147-CDP-MEL-HCA, for new construction on a vacant 3,300 square foot lot, for a 2,250 square foot, 23 foot high single family dwelling and ADU, with 2 parking spaces in an attached garage.

11. Motion recommending that the Al Fresco Dining Ordinance must exclude the Coastal Zone.

Resolved, Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council requests that the Al Fresco Dining Ordinance exempt the Coastal Zone from the new regulations and that a Coastal Development Permit continue to be required for any expansion of service floor area for outdoor dining.

12. Motion requesting that the Mayor include Neighborhood Council input in the choice of General Manager of the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment.

Resolved, the Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council requests that the Mayor include current and past board members, experienced in the Neighborhood Council system, to provide insight into the skills and character and all other criteria for the next General Manager for Department of Neighborhood Empowerment ensuring this is an open and transparent process from the inception of the search for the General Manager through final selection.

13. Motion urging Los Angeles Neighborhood Council Coalition to recommend extending the review of the Digital Communication Policy.

Resolved, the Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council requests that the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners (BONC) extend the review of the Digital Communication Policy by an additional six (6) months to allow time for BONC to set up programs to educate NCs and actively solicit input before they consider the policy a success or failure.

14. Motion to express concern to the Mayor regarding the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners.

Resolved, the Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council expresses concerns to the Mayor and requests and evaluation of the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners (BONC) based on increased concerns being expressed about Commissioner attendance, Commissioner comments criticizing freedom of speech, vote flipping, and the need for BONC to be more responsive to the needs of Neighborhood Councils.

15. Motion to support the annual Congress of Neighborhoods.

Resolved, the Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council shall allocate \$500 to support the annual Congress of Neighborhoods.

16. Motion to repeal Standing Rule 11 regarding conduct and recording of online meetings.

Resolved, the Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council repeals Standing Rule 11 (Conduct and recording of online meetings).

17. Motion to reallocate budget amounts to accommodate payment for meeting space and Neighborhood Purpose Grants.

The Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council shall reallocate \$5,500 in its budget from Outreach/Newsletters to Office Operations/Meeting Space and \$1,000 from Outreach/Newsletters to Neighborhood Purpose Grants.
