The Silver Lake Neighborhood Council Public Safety and Education Youth and Families Committees move to approve the following resolution standing with the South Central Neighborhood Council and community and in an effort to substantially reduce use of force incidents in the LAPD.

Whereas, Omar Abrego was beaten to death by LAPD's Newton Division August 2, 2014, in front of his home at 69th and Main St., still in his work uniform;

And Whereas, On August 11th, Ezell Ford was attacked, beaten to the ground and witnesses claim that he was shot three times in his back while walking in his neighborhood by LAPD's Newton Division;

And Whereas, both men were unarmed;

And Whereas, although according to LAPD Chief Charles Beck the autopsy results for both men have been available since August, the LAPD delayed the release of the Ezell Ford autopsy until December 29, 2014, and continues to refuse to release the autopsy report for Omar Abrego to the family and to the public;

And Whereas, this has led to increased concerns in our community that the LAPD is trying to conceal the truth of how these men died;

And Whereas, the families and the community have a right to know how and why these men were killed;

And Whereas, there is no legitimate reason to maintain secrecy other than to cover up the continued abuse of power in the LAPD;

Be it therefore resolved that, the Silver Lake Neighborhood Council fully supports the South Central community's demand that the autopsy results be released immediately;

Be it further resolved that, we call on Councilmen Tom LaBonge and Mitch O'Farrell to introduce and/or support a resolution to the Los Angeles City Council to direct the Los Angeles Police Department to release these autopsy reports immediately\*. The families of Omar Abrego and Ezell Ford and our community have the right to know their cause of death.

\*The autopsy results for Mr. Ford have been released.

The Public Safety and Education, Youth & Families Committees move to stand with the South Central Neighborhood Council by approving the following resolution and requesting Councilmembers Tom LaBonge (CD 4)and Mitch O'Farrell (CD 13) to introduce and/or support the resolution before the Los Angeles City Council chamber:

Whereas, accountability for the Los Angeles Police Department has not been achieved through the establishment of the Police Commission, an appointed review board with no authority to discipline police officers;

And whereas, accountability for the Los Angeles Police Department has not been achieved through the establishment of the Federal Consent Decree;

And whereas, abuses of power by the Los Angeles Police Department continue to violate the Human and Civil Rights of the residents of Los Angeles;

And whereas, democracy and community control is the only way to ensure accountability for public institutions and to promote the general welfare;

Be it therefore resolved that, the Silver Lake Neighborhood Councils calls upon Councilmen Tom LaBonge and Mitch O'Farrell to introduce a resolution to the Los Angeles City Council to place on the ballot an amendment to the Los Angeles City Charter establishing democratic, community control over the Los Angeles Police Department through an all-elected, all-civilian, police control board with full authority over the department in all aspects at all levels.
