4.2 **Motion:** GTLNC supports <u>CF 23-1338</u> (Padilla, Raman. Van Nuys Airport [VNY] / VNY Vision Study / Community Engagement Strategies) and <u>CF 23-1339</u> (Padilla, Raman. Van Nuys Airport Specific Plan / Citizens Advisory Committee / Forensic Audit / Economic Study / Noise Mitigation / Community Benefit Program) and calls for greater transparency and community engagement in the Van Nuys Airport Plan and Vision Study process.

GTLNC is aware of an increased exposure to Van Nuys Airport (VNY) jet charter traffic, one of the busiest general aviation airports in the nation, over its airspace which exasperates the burden already felt from BUR departures over our area. Despite densely populated residential areas existing prior to VNY's redevelopment over the past 20 years, no mitigation policy measures were created by Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA) to mandate such considerations. GTLNC requests that LA City Council instruct Los Angeles City Planning Department, with LAWA, and in consultation with Council District 6 as Committee Chair responsible for the formation and/or operation of the Van Nuys Airport Specific Plan Citizens Advisory Committee, to convene the necessary Citizens Advisory Committee meetings to provide input during all phases of the development process of the Van Nuys Airport Specific Plan and its relevant studies; to include at least one local resident / stakeholder from, but not limited to, Council Districts 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6; and enable Council District office staff participation. This will help PROTECT valley residents and everyone near VNY. We need LA City Council to keep LAWA in check. Toxic fumes pour out of VNY and are getting worse. LAWA must be accountable and transparent. They can't grow at the expense of the lives and health of residents.

PUBLIC INPUT AT NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL MEETINGS: The public is permitted to address the assembly on any agenda item before action is taken on an item. Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered. Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the assembly's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the assembly is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future meeting. Public comment may be limited to a fixed time per speaker or a limited number of speakers by the presiding officer of the assembly. Those wishing to make comment, but not wanting to speak publicly, may submit written communications to the Board.
