- 4. Legislation of possible interest to Greater Toluca Lake on which GTLNC may wish to take a position:
 - 4.1 Discussion on possible repeal of Proposition 47 (Prop 47) passed by California voters in 2014. The law made some non-violent property crimes, where the value does not exceed \$950, into misdemeanors. It also made some simple drug possession offenses into misdemeanors and provides that past convictions for these charges may be reduced to a misdemeanor by a court.
 - 4.2 <u>Memorandum of Understanding between Caltrans and City of Los Angeles</u> to identify specific maintenance functions Local Agency will perform in the State right of way, including highway and freeway areas situated within Local Agency's jurisdictional limits. Has potential to break through service delays and backlog of service requests.
 - 4.3 AB 817 (Pacheco), Open Meetings, Teleconferencing, Subsidiary Body. AB 817 would allow all public meetings conducted by certain government bodies to take place entirely virtually, excusing officials who serve on a wide range of local government bodies from having to show up in person.
