Greater Toluca Lake Neighborhood Council (GTLNC) Community Impact Statement

GTLNC opposes <u>Council File 25-0642</u> (Blumenfeld, Raman) Off-Street Parking / Requirement Elimination / New Developments / Change of Use / Cost-Benefit Analysis.

The 2022 Statute (California Government Code, Section 65863.2, authored by Laura Friedman, Assembly Bill 2097) which authorizes the damaging elimination of minimum parking requirements for new construction renders this proposal unnecessary. The Statute has not triggered building of so-called "affordable housing." At best the Statute may yield only 10% so-called "affordable housing" and 90% luxury units, many of which are currently unoccupied as a search of internet apartment listing sites confirms, with many sites swamped with such luxury unit listings.

It is a waste of taxpayer funds and a misapplication of precious resources to pursue an initiative which has proven to be not only ineffective but damaging, especially in the midst of our City's nearly \$1 billion budget deficit as well as recent disclosures about Councilmember bribery and staff corruption, management incompetence, squandered and missing public funds, reduced city services, disabled contractor tracking mechanisms, uncollected fees and fines, and layoffs.
