6). Committee Reports

A. Planning & Zoning

- i. Case No. ZA-2023-1767-CUB-CUX-1A, 3020 S. Crenshaw Blvd.: UNNC previously voted to support the adaptive reuse of the historic Kakusai Theater into an event hall with dancing and alcohol. Appellant First Right Capital Investments LLC / Hakimianpour Santa Monica Group L.L.C. (owners of adjacent Burger King at 3036 S. Crenshaw) filed an appeal based on several concerns, including the dispensing of alcoholic beverages, the potential impacts on the shared parking lots (via reciprocal easements on both properties); traffic ingress and egress; and a stated lack of notice of the case itself. (The Appeal Justification Narrative is posted in the online agenda packet). -- DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION.
- Case No. DIR-2023-4323-TOC-CCMP-HCA, 3050 West Pico Blvd. (Harvard Heights): Proposed 5-story, mixed-use building with 28 residential units (inc.3 affordable ELI units) and 570 square foot of ground floor commercial, 24 parking spaces (2 commercial), located within Harvard Heights HPOZ. Request TOC incentives of increased height (11 feet/2 stories) and reduced side yards plus waiver of required street dedication; along with HPOZ certificate of compatibility/CCMP (not within UNNC purview). – DISCUSSION AND ACTION

B. Environmental Committee

 i. Proposed Community Impact Statement (CIS) re: Council File 23-0801, Protecting Street Trees / Administrative Citation Enforcement (ACE) Program/ Fine Schedule: According to the motion, the current enforcement mechanism for protecting street trees - fines levied through the the Administrative Citation Enforcement (ACE) program -- lumps damages to our urban canopy in the miscellaneous category of administrative violations that limit fines to a maximum of \$1,000 for a third or subsequent offense. However, trees are invaluable assets in our communities' climate resilience and fines for their removal, abuse, molestation, or destruction should reflect this. This motion requests that a new fine schedule be adopted that is commensurate with damages including but not limited to loss of shade, loss of carbon storage, increase to local average surface temperature of the street, decrease in local air quality, and tree species. UNNC's Environmental Committee recommends SUPPORT for this Council motion. – DISCUSSION AND ACTION

If members of the public are unable to provide public comment or be heard due to issues within the Neighborhood Council's control, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned.

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Telecommunication Relay Services

Telephone communication is one of the most important forms of communication in society today. Due to advancements in technology, telephone devices have evolved with new services and capabilities. Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing, and individuals with a speech disability are following these trends and are rapidly migrating to more advanced telecommunications methods, both for peer-to-peer and third-party telecommunications relay service (TRS) communications.

Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. TRS is available in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. territories for local and/or long distance calls. TRS providers – generally telephone companies - are compensated for the costs of providing TRS from either a state or a federal fund. There is no cost to the TRS user. What forms of TRS are available? There are several forms of TRS, depending on the particular needs of the user and the equipment available: TRS includes: Text to Voice TIY-Based TRS; Speech-to-Speech Relay Service; Shared Non-English Language Relay Service; Captioned Telephone Relay Service; Internet Protocol Relay Service; and Video Relay Service.

Don't hang up! Some people hang up on TRS calls because they think the Communications Assistant (CA) is a telemarketer. If you hear, "Hello. This is the relay service ... " when you pick up the phone, please don't hang up! You are about to talk, through a TRS provider, to a person who is deaf, hard-of-hearing, or has a speech disability.

If you have limitations hearing or speaking a specially-trained CA can relay telephone conversations for all of your calls. In California, dial 711 to reach the California Relay Service (CRS). If you prefer having your calls immediately answered in your mode of communication, dial one of the toll-free modality- and language-specific numbers below. The call will be routed to the CRS provider.

No part of the conversation that takes place between callers is revealed or recorded in written, verbal, or any other form. CRS CAs do not participate in the conversation and acquire no benefit from information relayed.
