A. Approve Draft Letter regarding Proposed “Paseo Alley” (Exposition Place) Greening: Request that CD10 prepare a Council motion in support of the previously-approved (by Metro) alley greening project as part of the First Mile Last Mile program. – **REVIEW LETTER, DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION**

B. Possible Community Impact Statement (CIS) for Council File 25-1538, Park Needs Assessment:

The Department of Recreation and Parks (RAP) has submitted its 2025 Citywide Park Needs Assessment (PNA) to the City Council for ratification and adoption. UNNC supports the PNA and its ideas of a new parks classification system and a stated “process of continuous updating.” But although the PNA acknowledges that many neighborhoods in Los Angeles lack sufficient park space and equitable access, and that billions of dollars in investment are needed to expand parkland and improve conditions citywide, it does not present equitable solutions. Specifically, the current PNA maps do not fully reflect the park deficit experienced within the UNNC footprint. Despite UNNC's high population density and significant transit infrastructure, our community does not currently receive the "Priority Status" our need warrants. The PNA fails to account for the significant fracturing of the community and ongoing environmental impacts of the 10 freeway; and it appears to force South Los Angeles communities to compete with each other for RAP's limited funds. Equity is not achieved if one high-need neighborhood is passed over to serve another within the same region. Even though UNNC's neighborhoods are among those historically impacted by park scarcity and limited open space, urban heat island effects, and environmental burdens including a lack of tree canopy, UNNC's footprint was excluded from the PNA's targeted parks. Failure to include UNNC areas in the PNA framework risks reinforcing existing inequities rather than correcting them. – **DISCUSSION AND ACTION**

9). UNNC Planning & Zoning Committee:

A. Update RE Open Space Element Preliminary Draft: The Open Space Element Update addresses environmental justice, climate resilience and rewilding opportunities in alignment with City priorities and Senate Bill 1425 (2022). A revised draft will be prepared which will also include implementation programs, and it will advance to the adoption process in Summer 2026. – **DISCUSSION**

B. Update - Objective Standards for Historic Districts: The L.A. City Planning Department (LADCP) will hold a virtual public workshop on **MONDAY, April 13 from 6 - 8 p.m.** to discuss the Objective Design Standards (ODS) for Infill Housing in Historic Preservation Overlay Zones (HPOZs). LADCP is developing ODS for infill housing, mixed-use infill, and Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) in its local historic districts. California has passed new laws that are aimed at streamlining the permitting and construction of new housing. Because these laws require that municipalities streamline review by applying only ODS for most types of multi-family housing projects, Los Angeles needs to develop its own set of context-driven standards for its local historic districts. Further Brown Act Updates: Public comments cannot be required to be submitted in advance of the meeting. Only real-time public comment is required. If broadcasting interruptions prevent the public from observing or hearing the meeting, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned. If members of the public are unable to provide public comment or be heard due to issues within the Neighborhood Council's control, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned.

If a Neighborhood Council has a quorum of board members in a physical location, board members who wish to join the meeting via teleconferencing must adhere to AB 2449 rules and regulations. If a Neighborhood Council does not have a quorum of board members in a physical location, they shall adhere to SB 707 rules and regulations.

Further SB 707 Updates: In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. [California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(3)]

(C) The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. [California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(4)]

(D) Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate. [California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(5)]

(E) (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed. [California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(A)]

(ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment. [California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(B)]

(iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.

Telecommunication Relay Services: Telephone communication is one of the most important forms of communication in society today. Due to advancements in technology, telephone devices have evolved with new services and capabilities. Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing, and individuals with a speech disability are following these trends and are rapidly migrating to more advanced telecommunications methods, both for peer-to-peer and third-party telecommunications relay service (TRS) communications.

Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. TRS is available in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. territories for local and/or long distance calls. TRS providers – generally telephone companies - are compensated for the costs of providing TRS from either a state or a federal fund. There is no cost to the TRS user.

What forms of TRS are available? There are several forms of TRS, depending on the particular needs of the user and the equipment available: TRS includes: Text to Voice TTY-Based TRS; Speech-to-Speech Relay Service; Shared Non-English Language Relay Service; Captioned Telephone Relay Service; Internet Protocol Relay Service; and Video Relay Service.

Don't hang up! Some people hang up on TRS calls because they think the Communications Assistant (CA) is a telemarketer. If you hear, "Hello. This is the relay service . . ." when you pick up the phone, please don't hang up! You are about to talk, through a TRS provider, to a person who is deaf, hard-of-hearing, or has a speech disability.

If you have limitations hearing or speaking a specially-trained CA can relay telephone conversations for all of your calls. In California, dial 711 to reach the California Relay Service (CRS). If you prefer having your calls immediately answered in your mode of communication, dial one of the toll-free modality- and language-specific numbers below. The call will be routed to the CRS provider.
