Proposed hours of operation are from 11 am to 4 am daily with alcohol cut off at 2:00 am.

Proposed Use: Same with the full line of alcoholic beverages. Conditional Use Permit to allow the sale of full line of alcoholic beverages for an expanded 6,320 square feet. 233-seat restaurant operating 11 am to 2 am, daily.
