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SUMMARY

The information in this report outlines the fire prevention inspection activities, by quarter, for calendar year 2020. The report summarizes the productivity of each section in the Fire Prevention Bureau (FPB) with the exception of the Certified Unified Program Agency Section.

RECOMMENDATION

DISCUSSION

By utilizing a FireStat process for internal performance management, capturing and tracking data and related metrics, the FPB has continued to increase work efficiencies. This foundation gives the FPB the ability to plan, organize and project fire prevention activities on a weekly, monthly, quarterly or annual basis. Also, with increased training and emphasis placed on follow-up inspections there has been a steady increase in the numbers of re-inspections completed.






PLAN CHECK AVERAGE WAIT TIME (METRO)



PLAN CHECK AVERAGE WAIT TIME (VAN NUYS)





AVERAGE WAIT TIME (WEST)






PLAN CHECK AVERAGE WAIT TIME (METRO)



This section's Legal Unit handles issues regarding fire and life safety violations, internal appeal and court hearings. The

Legal Unit is the liaison for the City Attorney's Office for filing more egregious fire, life and safety violations.

Greater emphasis on fire code compliance by the fire department has resulted in a dramatic increase in legal cases submitted.
